

## Global Finance's Central Banker Report Cards 2017

NEW YORK, August 29, 2017 — *Global Finance* magazine has released its Central Banker Report Cards 2017.

The Central Banker Report Cards, published annually by *Global Finance* since 1994, grade the central bank governors of 83 key countries and the European Union.

The heads of the Central Banks of Australia, Honduras, Israel, Lebanon, Morocco, Paraguay, Russia, Taiwan and the United States received a prestigious "A" grade this year. In addition, the Central Bankers of Brazil, the Dominican Republic and Jordan earned "A-" grades.

For the first time, central bankers from the following countries have been added to the list: Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Honduras, Jamaica, Nicaragua, Myanmar, Nepal, DR Congo and Tanzania.

Grades are based on an "A" to "F" scale for success in areas such as inflation control, economic growth goals, currency stability and interest rate management. ("A" represents an excellent performance down through "F" for outright failure.) Subjective criteria also apply.

*Global Finance* publisher and editorial director Joseph Giarraputo notes, "Central bankers are entering a tightening phase, trying to pull back from quantitative easing and let their economies have more free rein, but it is no easy task to turn around the ship of state finance. Policy adjustments now will enable more options later if the nascent global recovery falters. Our performance reviews for these finance leaders show that some manage to stay ahead of the curve even under difficult circumstances, while others are hampered by political or economic realities."

The full Central Banker Report Cards 2017 report will be published in the October issue of *Global Finance*.
